All employees and dependents that join the challenge will be entitled to the Fitbit Inspire 2 if they did not receive one on the previous challenge while supplies last!

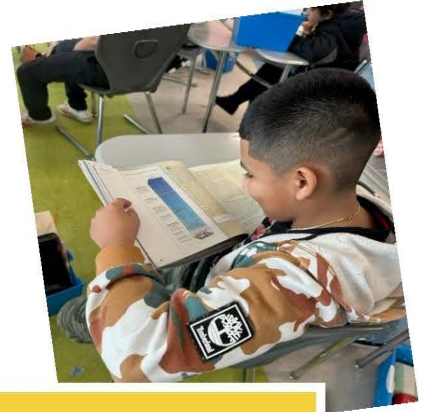
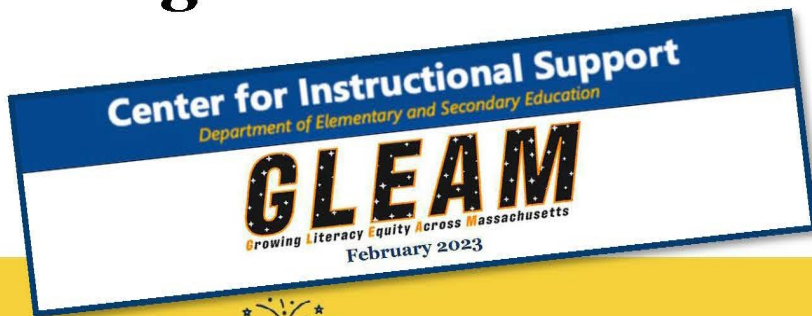

Well Done, Brockton, Everett, and New Bedford!

Though summer 2024 may seem a far way off, many districts have started thinking about the end of the GLEAM Cohort 1 program and how they will sustain and scale literacy improvements for years to come. Brockton, Everett, and New Bedford have been focusing on building the instructional leadership capacity of school leaders through guided professional learning, walkthroughs, job-embedded coaching, and distributive leadership. This focal area is an essential step in ensuring the GLEAM work continues well beyond the grant funding period and becomes truly embedded across the district. The Massachusetts Department of Elementary and Secondary Education Center for Instructional Support recognized NBPS for its innovative work supporting year two of the elementary literacy program implementation. This recognition comes after recent classroom observations by [TNTP](#), a reputable non-profit organization partnering with districts across the country to improve literacy outcomes.

The observations showed great improvement across all categories: a culture of learning, use of high-quality texts, strong questioning and student ownership. Overall, a 50% improvement was seen! Desired practices were observed twice as frequently in January 2023 than in October 2022.

In addition, improvements in the use of high-quality texts have increased to exceptional levels; all key actions in this area were observed at least 80% of the time, an increase from 67% in the fall. Teachers and leaders at the participating schools are credited with the hard work necessary for this improvement: Ashley, Campbell, Carney, Gomes, Hathaway, Jacobs, Lincoln and RCIS.

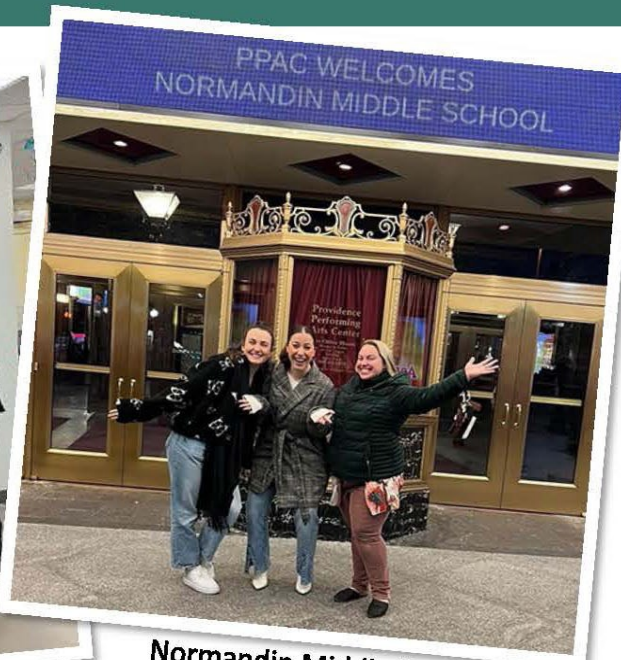

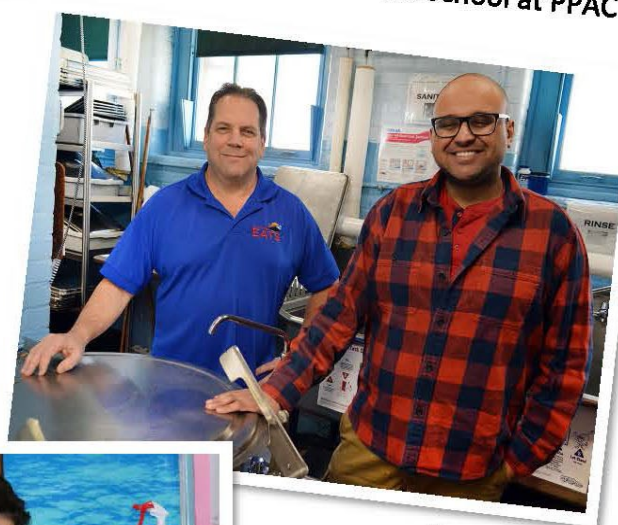
