3. APPROVAL OF MINUTES

The School Committee voted UNANIMOUSLY, on a motion by Mr. John Oliveira and seconded by Mr. Christopher Cotter, to accept the following School Committee meeting minutes (supporting documents #3).

4. PUBLIC COMMENT

No public participation requested.

5. STUDENT REPRESENTATIVE REPORT

The School Committee welcomed the new incoming student representative, Raina Grace. Ms. Grace had nothing to report for her first meeting. Ms. Grace shared with the committee her goals and aspirations as a student representative. Ms. Grace noted that she values diversity and the accomplishments of the student population and would like to highlight these during her tenure.

6. SUPERINTENDENT REPORT

Mr. Anderson asked for a moment of silence for the loss of a Keith Middle School faculty member. He also shared the success of the first ever, staff end of year event held at the NBHS Beardsworth-Gonsalves Gym on Friday, June 14th,

A. Special Recognition: Mr. Anderson paid recognition and presented New Bedford High School faculty, Mr. Takeru Nagayoshi with the NBPS Recognition Award for the 2020 Massachusetts Teacher of the year. Mr. Nagayoshi shared how he would use this recognition to help promote the New Bedford Public School within the

community and elsewhere. The school committee shared congratulatory remarks to Mr. Nagayoshi for his achievement.

- B. Food Service: Mr. Rob Shaheen, NBPS Food Service Director updated the School Committee on the "Breakfast After the Bell" programming. As of date, the program has served 3.2 million meals in 32 schools, with 26 of them being NBPS. Participation totals are over 80% breakfast and over 75% lunch. Mr. Shaheen shared upcoming improvements to the program will include: branding, new website, updating/replacing obsolete food service equipment, farm to school and district wide wellness projects. Mayor Mitchell suggested connecting with the local fishing industry, Mass in Motion, and the Coastal Food Shed group. Mr. Bruce Livramento requested how students are receiving this information and how are we aiding in expanding student diets. Mr. John Oliveira had concerns about waste and would like the percentage of waste tracked. Mr. Shaheen shared the work being done with students and the UMass Extension program, tracking and minimizing food waste, as well as informational changes to enhance the NBPS website including making it interactive. Mr. Anderson added that the schools Wellness Committee is getting back up and running and will help aid in the process of programs like "Breakfast After the Bell".
- C. General Updates: Mr. Anderson shared that NBPS will be reviewing data points for MCAS, attendance, test data, bench mark assessments, etc. and will update the committee on the status in the upcoming July school committee meeting. Mr. Anderson also notified the committee on how all city educators have been meeting during the year to access what each other's root causes are and how all can work together to strengthen educational collaborations to better care for our students.

Mr. Anderson updated the School Committee on students returning to NBPS due to the Alma Del Mar Charter School not passing Massachusetts legislation. The 159 students that were slated for charter will be returning to the NBPS. Mr. Anderson assured the School Committee that families have been notified and NBPS has been in communication with families and Alma Del Mar to ensure a smooth transition for students involved. Mr. Christopher Cotter had concerns about feedback from the charter school. Mr. Anderson stated there have not been many complaints and he will continue to communicate with Alma Del Mar throughout this process. Mr. Christopher Cotter asked for a follow up on feedback from affected families. Mr. Anderson and Ms. Karen Treadup shared that there was little feedback from families due to how transparent NBPS has been throughout the process along with personal phone calls to the families.

Mr. Anderson discussed the upcoming NBPS Leadership Institute and updated the committee on how the staff would be working on ways to provide additional support to our schools, access and equity, instructional focus in classrooms, leadership capacity, as well as, finding additional ways for our schools to continue to grow. Mr. Anderson also shared that central administrators would be attending an annual retreat to review and set new goals and objectives for the upcoming school year. The retreat would also be an opportunity for administrators to discuss ways to support each other's roles with a focus on equity.

7. OTHER REPORTS

A. Finance and Operations Reports

Finance Report

Mr. Andrew O'Leary reviewed the financial reports. Mr. O'Leary started with the Function Code and departmental Report and reported that at the end of this fiscal year to date 82% spent is encumbered, over all we are slightly ahead of last fiscal year at this point. Mr. O'Leary reviewed the Salary Report and noted the anticipated balance surplus will increase due to the report being from the month of May. Plan is the Circuit breaker (\$1.3 balance) and the ability to pre-pay Special Education tuition. These are the 2 main items used for surplus.

7A. Transfers Report

Mr. O'Leary reminded the committee that at the last meeting it was authorized for the sub-committee chair to sign off on transfers. Transfers were closed out and they were able to get a jump start on projects like phone upgrades and facility work (transferring preventative maintenance analysis done at 3 schools).

The School Committee voted UNANIMOUSLY on a motion made by Mr. Bruce Oliveira and seconded by Mr. Jack Livramento to approve all transfers.

7A. Grants Report

Mr. O'Leary also reviewed the Grant Report and noted that it is June and there has been no information from the Department of Elementary and Secondary Education (DESE) on allocations for the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA) and Title I. There is a large carry over so grants are secure right now.

7A. Building Report

Mr. O'Leary reviewed the Building Report and noted that final audits are being done. Taylor, Jacobs and the four school accelerator repair projects are in final payment. The Brooks project is starting the last week of June. The Trinity and Parker roof project have been awarded to general contractor. The high school auditorium project is done and has minor punch list items. The high school locker rooms went out for re-bid and will have a potential mid-October completion.

The School Committee voted UNANIMOUSLY on a motion made by Mr. Bruce Oliveira and seconded by Mayor Mitchell to accept the Finance and Operations Reports.

7B. Personnel Report

Ms. Heather Emsley shared updates on the Personnel Report. Ms. Emsley reports 27 new appointments, 6 retirements, 27 resignations, 14 substitutes and 31 transfers in personnel. 90% of new hires are licensed.

The School Committee voted UNANIMOUSLY on a motion made by Mr. Bruce Oliveira and seconded by John Oliveira to accept the Personnel Report.

7C. School Committee Report

Mayor Mitchell gave congratulatory marks for the great job done by the faculty and custodians at the NBHS graduation. Mayor Mitchell also congratulated Lou St. John on his retirement and all the work he has done throughout his career at NBPS.

Mr. Jack Livramento gave congratulatory remarks to the NBHS graduating class and gave reminders to parents to continue to work with their children in ensuring they keep up with their assigned summer reading projects. Mr. Livramento would like parents to be a guide for their student and enjoy the free summer activities and lunches the city has to offer over the summer.

Mr. Christopher Cotter also gave congratulatory remarks to the NBHS Class of 2019.

Mr. John Oliveira reiterated that the School Committee is not going to spend money on man traps for the safety in the schools if they are not being used appropriately. Mr. Oliveira feels we need consistency in the schools with the dismissal process. Mr. Oliveira realizes that NBPS does not have responsibility for Parker School but, wants to see an update from DESE regarding the Parker School. He feels if DESE is not showing improvement then the Parker School should be demanded back.

8. NEW BUSINESS

- A. The Committee voted UNANIMOUSLY, on a motion by Mr. Joshua Amaral and seconded by Bruce Oliveira to approve a recommended list of surplus property located at the Paul Rodrigues Administration Building.
- B. Mr. Anderson highlighted and explained the purpose for the newly developed position, Executive Director for Initiatives and District Partnerships. This position would help in executing and meeting district goals, as well as, seeking out grant funding to aid in the process. This position would bring the New Bedford Public Schools in alignment to work in partnerships with the University of Massachusetts Dartmouth, Bristol Community College and other surrounding colleges.

The Committee voted UNANIMOUSLY, on a motion by Mr. Bruce Oliveira and seconded by Mr. Jack Livramento to approve the newly created Executive Director for Initiatives and District Partnerships.
